	The text stimulus that we will be using will include: Travel brochures, Fiction – short stories e.g Fables, Myths and Letters.
RE	Focus on how the Church began. Make the link between the coming of the Holy Spirit to the
	Apostles and the start and spread of the early Christian church. Understand the significance of the
	events of Pentecost, recognise what Christians believe about the Holy Spirit. Focus on why Christians share communion. Understand that communion is an act of remembrance, sharing and
	reflection for Christians focusing on the belief that Jesus died so that there could be a new
	relationship between God and people. Recognise that communion is linked to the Passover meal
•	and that by sharing communion as a group Christians are showing unity.
Art	Fantasy Mini Beasts; We will be studying insects before designing and creating our own 3D models.
Geography	Focus on Brazil and South America. Describe and compare human and physical geographical
	features (e.g climate zones, types of settlement) and describe their geographical patterns in words,
	diagrams and maps using subject specific vocabulary backed up by non-technical general language) Compare some human and physical features of Brazil with another place (e.g UK). Use
	evidence collected to give reasons for and against visiting Brazil. Give examples of how people are
	trying to protect or improve the environment of a place in Brazil
Music	As a foundation to learning music, we will listen and appraise a range of different music, including
	well known songs. We will also take part in a range of activities such as musical games, singing, playing instruments, improvising, composing and performing.
PE/Games	Carnival dance, athletics (including running and fielding events) and rounders.
Numeracy	Fractions: recognise and show equivalent fractions, compare and order unit fractions, solve
	problems to do with fractions, add and subtract fractions with the same denominator.
	Measurement – time: Tell and write the time including 12 and 24 hour clock, estimate and read time to the nearest minute, compare time in minutes, hours and seconds, use time vocabulary, compare
	time durations.
	Property of shape: recognise angles as a property of a shape, identify right angles, draw 2D

	and parallel lines Measurement – mass and capacity: measure, compare, add and subtract mass and volume,
	solve problems involving measure and use the appropriate tools and units of measure.
ICT	Consider the implications of internet privacy and become aware of the safe use of the internet and
	email, consider what information would be appropriate to give over the internet (with a focus on
DT	completing internet surveys) Moving monsters through exploring pneumatic systems.
Science	We are learning about forces and magnets. We can recognise what a force is and where they take
	place. Complete a range of investigations on forces and magnets with a focus on fair testing.
	We are learning about light and shadow. Understand that we need light to see things and that dark
	is the absence of light, that light is reflected from surfaces, recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and there are ways we can protect our eyes, that shadows are formed when the light
	from a source is blocked by a solid object and further investigations about shadows.
French	Focus on animals. Know the vocabulary for some pets and can respond to questions about them;
	have an understanding of the plurals of animal words; can use simple phrases to describe them,
	listen to a story and select key words and phrases from it; begin to recognise, read and pronounce words and set phrases; speak clearly and confidently; write familiar words and phrases from a
	model.
	French café – use food and drink vocabulary and ask and answer questions.
