# Trips & Visits

There have been several trips and visits over the past half-term: On Friday 17th May, Y4 visited Nower Wood Outdoor Education Centre while Y5 became Greeks for the day here in school!

Year 4 investigated different types of habitat within the woodlands, conducted an experiment to determine different soil types and created wonderful natural art in the style of Andy Goldsworthy which they really enjoyed.

Year 5 enthusiastically re-enacted being Greeks with the Rainbow Theatre workshop in the morning, and then took part in a Greek feast in the afternoon. The children found it fun and interesting particularly solving the Ancient Greek murder mystery, learning about Greek myths and their characters and tasting Greek food. All the children looked great in their costumes.

Year 6 visited Dapdune Wharf this week to learn more about their topic on Rivers. They completed a river study to test current speed, quality of water and explored river defences that were in place. They explored an old barge and were amazed by the augmented reality sandbox when challenged to make their own river. Thank you to all our staff and parent helpers for making these trips such a success.

On Monday 20th May, twelve Year 5 pupils visited Godalming Baptist church and the Quaker meeting house with Mrs Alder. They were given a tour of both places of worship, and were allowed to take photographs and ask questions to the church leaders. The children have now been challenged to produce a whole school assembly explaining some of the similarities and differences between these Christian denominations. All of Year 5 have been studying Christianity in its many forms and this visit aimed to enhance their learning and the learning of others in RE.

### **BAE Systems Visit**

Yesterday Years 4, 5 and 6 were treated to a thrilling special assembly by three visitors from the RAF, Royal Navy and BAE Systems. The children were gripped from the word go when two of the presenters zoomed over the stage on hover boards. The assembly promoted science and engineering of communication systems which was brought to life by lots of audience participation. The children tested infrared night vision goggles, saw programmable


# Sports Day at Busbridge CofE Junior School - Sports Day Friday 14th June
