
Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **School in September**

Our plans for September 2020 are moving on a pace. Below you will see an overview.

- Basic principles from the DfE: (i) Minimise the number of contacts that a pupil has during the school day (ii) Have controls to reduce the risk of transmission.
- Children will be in school full-time, in classes of 30.
- Due to organisational logistics we are organising the children into year group bubbles.
- Timings: we will have staggered drop off / pick up. They will be at 8.50am or 9.00am and 3.15pm or 3.30pm.
- Day trips and visits will still take place
- Breakfast Club & After School Club will start up again (with restrictions in place)
- After school clubs We are working on plans to enable these to happen, again with some restrictions in place.
  Risk assessments for each individual club are currently being undertaken and details will be shared once these have been completed.
- Autumn Term curriculum: we will carry on with the planned Autumn curriculum. However we will have more stringent assessments at the start of term to pick up on gaps in knowledge, especially in maths and English. We will look to challenge all children, regardless of whether they have struggled with progress in home learning or made super progress at home during Lockdown.
- Peripatetic music lessons are able to take place. Individual risk assessments are being carried out and further details will follow.
- We have just received information from the government regarding catch-up funding for our school. This will supplement the plans we have already put in place.
