School News - Mrs Barker

Within the Godalming Learning Partnership, schools work collaboratively. On occasions we support each other during periods of staff absence. Milford Infant School are in a position whereby they require SENCO cover for a period of time. We will therefore be 'lending' them Mrs Barker on a Tuesday for a while. Mrs Friend is taking over Mrs Barker's Tuesday morning teaching in 3BF and while Mrs Barker will be contactable via e mail, she will be at Milford rather than BJS on Tuesdays.

"I've Bumped My Head" Wristbands!

Last week in school we started trialling new "I bumped my head" wristbands, instead of stickers. We have introduced the paper wristbands (similar to the ones you receive at festivals!) because we noticed that stickers were falling off jumpers/tops and being lost when children changed for PE or clubs. We hope that the new wristbands will be a better way for staff to clearly identify children who have had a head bump during the school day.

Village Hall Car park—can you help?

Last year we asked if parents/carers could contribute towards the cost of the hire of the Village Hall car park. The Village Hall allows our parents to use their car park for morning drop offs and afternoon pickups, however this comes at a financial cost to our school (a four-figure sum per annum). So that we can continue to provide this facility, we need to ask parents who use the car park to make a voluntary contribution of £15 per year towards this cost. If you are able to make this voluntary contribution, we ask that you log into your child's Arbor account and select Village Hall Car Park Contribution under 'Clubs' to make your payment. Like most schools our budget is under enormous pressure and it is hard to fund even the basics. Your support with this contribution will help our school funding go further.

Pupil Internet Usage Agreement

At the start of every term, we discuss the importance of online safety in school and remind all children about our BJS Pupil Internet Agreement. The agreement covers important online safety tips such as, only accessing the school internet when a teacher has given permission to do so; not sharing personal information online, including photos; and to always talk to a trusted adult if they are upset or made to feel uncomfortable by anything they see online. We have attached a copy of the agreement with this newsletter. Please do take the time to read it (specifically page 2), as there is important information on how you can support your child at home when they are using the internet for school work. Check they know what to do about safe surfing for homework and what to do if they see a strange link or pop-up advert. Remind them about passwords and being kind online. Sports Selection Policy

Last academic year 85% of our children 'pulled on the shirt' and represented our school in an interschool sporting event. This is a statistic of which we are very proud. Our sports selection policy tries to be as inclusive as possible, but sometimes it is not possible to select everyone who wishes to participate. We have a number of principles which guide our work in this area:

- 1. Some events we send our strongest squad and aim to win.
- 2. Other events we send a wider range of ability with the view of participation and enjoyment.
- 3. We keep a log of which child has attended which events. We try to share the events out so that everyone who wants to can participate in at least one event.
- 4. We do not try to ensure that each child attends an equal number of events, so some children will attend more than others.
- 5. On occasions we ask parents to assist with squad selection. This is generally when the parents involved have a better understanding of the children's abilities than we have in a specific sport.
- 6. For some events we ask children to self-nominate if they wish to take part. On other occasions we ask specific children (e.g. if they are yet to represent the school).


Superstars Board
