# Trips & Visits this half-term...

Year 3 had a fantastic day at The Look Out Discovery Centre to learn more about some of their science topics including forces, magnets and light. They enjoyed experimenting with a variety of hands-on science exhibits. Harrison from 3A said: "The plasma ball was epic and I loved how the electric lines met your fingers when you touched them". The children also went bug hunting in the forest - the rain didn't dampen their enthusiasm!

Y5 Royal School Challenge - Eight of our Y5 children excelled at the Royal School Challenge day which saw schools compete against each other in a number of topic challenges. These included 'build a catapult' (Science), facts on the Black Death quiz (History), ball skills (PE) and perform a small play (Drama). BJS had one of the smallest teams in number but the girls came joint 1st with St Edmunds and the boys came 3rd. A brilliant result and a trophy will follow as we are sharing it with St Edmunds! Thank you to Mrs Ellis-Cope for supervising the children on the day and was very proud of the team's performance as we all are.

Year 6 took part in the School Speedwatch initiative run by Surrey's Speedwatch team and local community police officers. Over the course of the day, 49 drivers were stopped for speeding outside the school and given questionnaires by the children which they found a very interesting exercise. Joining all the children for lunch in the dining hall, the police officers happily spoke to the children about their work as real life police officers which the children were very excited to learn about. # **Apollo Presentation**

Last Friday we had a very special visitor at BJS who gave a fascinating talk to the whole school – really out of this world! Our visitor was Pat Norris who worked in space technology industries for many years and was involved in the NASA Apollo missions. He told us all about the launch and flight of the Apollo 11 rocket, and shared pictures of that wonderful event, including playing actual footage taken from the Eagle as she came slowly down to settle on the surface of the moon. Buzz Aldrin sounded amazingly calm as he counted out the distance, and then we heard the iconic statement from Neil Armstrong 'the Eagle has landed'! 
The Greenest Class on Baseline Day was 6E (80% of school commutes were 'green')
