



Y6 KS2 Progress Scores since 2016/17

School performance can be measured in many ways. Two ways to measure academic performance is by tracking Attainment and Achievement:

- Attainment relates to the academic standards reached by pupil.
- Achievement measures progress made by pupils across a period of time.

Achievement / progress is a key way that the DfE measures school effectiveness. For our junior school it looks at how much progress children make from Y3 to Y6 (Key Stage Two), using their Y2/Key Stage One scores as a starting point.

The DfE calculate school progress scores and show them in 3 broad categories:

- A progress score of 0.0 is 'in line with national average progress'.
- 'Significantly above national progress'
- Significantly below national progress'

Our progress scores since 2016/17 are shown below. The upward trajectory is impressive, and highlights sustained improvement year on year.

This success belongs to the whole school community: children, staff, parents, Governors. All working together for the benefit of the children.
