Able Writers Literacy Workshop

A couple of weeks ago a group of Year 6 children attended a Literacy workshop with other local schools at St Edmunds. The children looked at descriptive extracts of writing, breaking them down into 'point-evidence analysis'. They then studied 2 characters before finishing the session by describing their own characters using what they had learnt.
