- Each class will be in its own bubble with separate accommodation, dining table area, classroom, toilets and shower facilities.

Accommodation

Individual chalets for each class:

4WT- Peaslake 4MB – Shere

- Boys and girls have their own dormitory, toilets and showering facilities. Staff bedrooms adjoin each dormitory.
- Each chalet is fitted with intruder alarms.
- Chalets are warm, comfortable and carpeted throughout.
- The common room / classroom for each class is part of their chalet.

Kit List

(NB: the kit list was emailed to Y4 parents before the Easter break)

- Please ensure everything is named!
- Children are responsible for their own possessions.
- Children should be able to carry their own belongings. (A wheelie bag can be a good option so the children can wheel their bags from the coach to their accommodation.)
- Every child should bring a packet of biscuits which must be nut free. These will be collected on the morning of departure by a teacher. These are shared between the class at break times and in the evenings.
- No mobile phones, cameras or electronic consoles please.
- £5 pocket money to purchase a souvenir.

<u>Medical</u>

- All medicines, labelled clearly with the child's name and dosage, to be handed in to staff member on morning of departure. Please ensure we are notified of any allergies.
- Inhalers and epipens please supply 2 per child if required. 1 will be kept with children at all times in the group leader's pack. A second inhaler and/or epipen will also be kept with the child's class teacher.
- Paracetamol will only be administered to your child if you have given written consent on the medical form.
- Illness/Accidents in the very rare instance of this happening we will contact you if extra medical attention is required.
