

'Annual Healthcheck' of Busbridge CE Junior School – a brief summary

Each year schools host a visit from a senior adviser in education to review the school's performance and aspiration. A report is written which highlights Strengths and Next Steps. This is then shared with staff and Governors. Earlier this term we received our healthcheck and I'm sure you will be interested to read some of the feedback the school received.

Strengths:

- The head teacher and deputy head teacher are a cohesive and highly effective team who have worked assiduously to provide the best education for pupils
- Academic standards have steadily risen over the past three years but aligned to these standards are efficacious systems of pastoral care that have resulted in an inclusive and thriving school environment.
- Attainment at the end of Key Stage 2 for reading, writing and maths is very strong,
- Leadership are rigorous in their monitoring and evaluation of the way teaching supports pupils to learn the curriculum.
- A calm and orderly environment is fostered in the school and the classroom by encouraging the setting of clear
- routines and expectations for the behaviour of pupils across all aspects of school life, not just in the classroom. - Teachers have a very good knowledge of the subjects they teach, and they present subject matter clearly and in a
- way that engages and motivates pupils.
- Behaviour for learning: evidence of a strong work ethic in all classrooms with pupils demonstrating high levels of motivation and engagement, with positive attitudes to their learning.

The Next Steps that she highlighted were focused around our ongoing development of the wider curriculum to ensure that teaching and learning remains strong across all subject areas. She also made some useful points regarding being 'Ofsted ready'.
