### £50 PER CLASS, PER TERM FOR BOOKS UPDATE

 Mrs Barker gave a huge thanks to the PTA for the large order of books the school has been able to make due to the £50 per term, per class allowance. For each class, the school has purchased a poetry set, a 'page turner' set and a 'class reads' set that are recommended by the author Pie Corbett (a highly respected English educational trainer, writer, author and poet – see photo below). Due to the large number of books that were ordered in one go, the school earnt £428.30 in reward points and made a significant saving, meaning there is still £413.26 remaining. The school proposes to spend the reward points, and the remaining amount on updating the books in the Year 4 corridor, which accessed by Year 3 and 4, as well as some of the older children (this has often come up as a request by parents at recent PTA meetings).



#### CHRISTMAS FAIR FEEDBACK AND NEW DATE

- KC to ask class reps to write up a 'lessons learnt' document from their stalls, and send to Jackie / Sarah, to provide insight and wisdom for the reps running the next Christmas Fair.
- Date for this year's Christmas Fair is Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> December.

## MULTI-USE SURFACE ON THE FIELD

- Mr Catchpole is in the process of gathering information on installing a multi-use surface in the central area of the school field.
- It is likely to cost around £70k, so much consideration and investigation will be taken in advance of any decision being made.
- More information in due course, along with fundraising ideas.

# **RECYCLING FACILITIES**

- KC to forward the figures for additional recycling facilities to Kirsty Morris.
- KC to ask Kirsty to contact the infant school regarding their recycling facilities and see if it is possible to create something similar at the junior school.

# UPGRADING THE SCHOOL'S ICT FOR LEARNING

- The school is in need of updating it's IT facilities and would like to invest in some new portable devices.
- Mr Catchpole and the school IT advisors have looked into all options and the best devices to invest in are the Chrome Books (considerably cheaper and better suited to the school, than iPads). The approximate cost for 30 x Chrome Books is £6.5K.
- The PCs in the ICT Suite are in need of an upgrade. This will enhance the learning that takes place in there. The replacement of the PCs will cost around £7.5K. It was agreed to focus our fund-raising efforts for the rest of this school year on this project (anticipating the new PCs in place for Sept 2020).

### GARDENING CLUB

• £20 for gardening gloves and £500 for raised beds will be donated to the Gardening Club by the PTA.

# **SMARTIES ACTIVITY – FEBRUARY**

- On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> Feb, all children will be given a tube of smarties so that once the sweets are eaten, the tube can be filled with 20ps (or £1's) by parents each time their child helps out. There are a small number of dairy free and gluten free children, so whoever is buying the smarties need to contact the office regarding how many alternatives need to be bought and for which class. The tubes and monies will be returned to school 3 weeks later.
- The money raised from this will be put towards the IT suite upgrade, which every student at the school will benefit from.
